No. S.O.4/C.A.59/1988/S.88/2020.- In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (5) of Section 88 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Central Act No. 59 of 1988), the Governor of Punjab is pleased to publish the following reciprocal Transport Agreement between the States of Punjab and Uttar Pradesh.

Notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration by the Government on or after the expiry of a period of thirty days from the date of publication of this notification in the Official Gazette, for inviting any objection or suggestion that may be received by Principal Secretary to Government of Punjab, Department of Transport, Punjab, Civil Mini Secretariat, Sector 9, Chandigarh from the State Transport Undertakings or any other person before the expiry of the period so specified with regard to the draft, namely:-

RECIPROCAL TRANSPORT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATES OF PUNJAB AND UTTAR PRADESH

This Agreement is made on the ______ day of ______ 2019 between the Governor of Punjab through Principal Secretary, Department of Transport, Government of Punjab (hereinafter referred to as "the Government of Punjab", which expression shall include its successors in office) of the one part and the Governor of Uttar Pradesh through Principal Secretary, Department of Transport, Government of Uttar Pradesh (hereinafter referred to as "the Government of Uttar Pradesh", which expression shall include its successor in office) of the second part.

WHEREAS, in view of the contiguity of the State of Punjab and Uttar Pradesh and rapid economic development of the country, it is expedient to encourage the long distance interstate transport of the passengers and goods between the State of Punjab and Uttar Pradesh and also to regulate, coordinate and control their operation, it is necessary to make a reciprocal agreement between the two reciprocating States.

AND WHEREAS, the parties hereto agree that in super-session of all previous agreements on the subject entered between the State of Punjab and Uttar Pradesh an agreement, on the terms and conditions set out hereinafter may be made between them.

NOW THIS DEED WITNESSES and the parties hereby mutually agree as under:

- 1. This Agreement shall come into force with effect from the date of its publication in Official Gazette of respective States.
- 2. General Concurrence for issue of Temporary Permits.

Section 88 (7) of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988 (hereinafter referred to as Act) provide that notwithstanding anything contained in Section 88(1), a Regional Transport Authority of one region may issue a temporary permit under section 87 to be valid in another Region or State, with the concurrence, given or for the particular occasion, of the Regional Transport Authority of that other State, as the case may be. In view of this specific provision of the Act, it was agreed that Regional/State Transport Authority of both of the State may issue temporary permits for goods carriages and contract carriage in pursuance of clause 4 and 6 of this Agreement as per need without requirement of countersignature under Section 88(1) of the Act.

- 3. Goods Carriage 5 Years Permit under Section 79 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.
 - (i) It is agreed that the Goods Carriage permits granted by State Transport Authority, Uttar Pradesh shall be valid for whole of the Punjab State subject to the countersignature by the State Transport Authority, Punjab, vice-versa permits granted by State Transport Authority, Punjab shall be valid for whole of the Uttar Pradesh subject to the countersignature by the State Transport Authority, Uttar Pradesh. These permits shall be countersigned by the Transport Authorities of the other State on the recommendations of the State/Regional Transport Authority concerned.

(ii) The goods carriage operating under countersigned permits shall not be used for picking up and setting down the goods between any two points lying exclusively within the territory of the reciprocating State, that is to say in such cases, vehicles shall be prohibited from

carrying on any business of transporting goods exclusively within the territory of the countersigning State and shall be subject to such condition as the concerned Transport Authority may deem fit to impose under section 79 and 84 of the Act.

4. Goods Carriage (Temporary Permit)

- (i) Subject to the provisions of clause (2) above, Goods Carriage permits as per need may be issued for a period not exceeding 30 (Thirty) days by either State in accordance with the provisions of section 87 of Act for plying on areas/routes in the other State as specified in the permit without any restriction on the number of permits and trips.
- (ii) These permits shall be issued subject to the following condition:-
 - (a) That no goods shall be picked up or set down between any two points lying wholly within the jurisdiction of the reciprocating State i.e such vehicle shall be prohibited from carrying on any business of transport exclusively within the territory of the other State.
 - (b) That an operator shall abide by any other conditions which the Authority may deem fit to impose under section 79(2) of Act.
 - (c) So far as Uttar Pradesh is concerned, tax payable to Government of Uttar Pradesh in respect of temporary permits shall be made through e-payment or Bank Drafts drawn on any Nationalized Bank of India. In case payment has been made through Bank Draft the temporary permit numbers shall be mentioned on the back of Bank Draft to avoid the possibility of its being misused or utilized against any other permit. Details of e-payment of the number, date and amount of the Bank draft, as the case maybe, shall be entered on the temporary permits. The Bank Draft shall be drawn in the name of the Transport Commissioner, Uttar Pradesh payable only at Headquarter of the Regional Transport Office in whose area the vehicle enters in Uttar Pradesh. So far as Punjab is concerned, the bank draft shall be drawn in the name of the

Transport Commissioner, Punjab, Chandigarh payable only at Headquarter of the Regional Transport Office in whose area the vehicle enters in Punjab. The bank draft shall be handed over by the driver or person in-charge of the vehicle on the border touching office of RTO/ARTO or mobile enforcement squad of the Transport Department which is nearest from the border before commencing the further journey. In case there is any deficiency in the amount of tax so remitted, it will be assessed and realized in cash at there for which necessary receipt in the prescribed form will be issued forthwith.

5. Motor Cab Five Years Permit under section 74 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988

The motor cabs permits under the contract carriage shall be countersigned by the Transport Authority of the two States on the recommendation of the Regional/State Transport Authority concerned for the area/routes specified in the permit. The countersignature shall be subject to the condition that the vehicle will not pick up or set down any passengers between any two points within the territory of the other State.

6 (1) Contract Carriage Permits (Temporary Permits)

Subject to the provision of clause (2) above, contract carriage, temporary permits may be issued as per need by the Transport Authority of one State for a specific route connecting the specified terminals in the reciprocating State. However, if for some reason the validity of the permit issued by one State expires in the territory of other State, a fresh temporary permit shall be obtained from the Transport Authority within whose jurisdiction the vehicle happens to be at that time after the payment of necessary fees and taxes.

- (i) Such Temporary permits shall be subject to the following conditions;
 - (a) Such temporary permit shall be valid for a period not exceeding fifteen (15) days.
 - (b) Passengers in excess of the seating capacity specified in the registration certificate shall not be carried and no standing passengers shall be allowed.

- (c) The contract carriage shall be hired by a single party and shall be used for a single return journey.
- (ii) Such temporary permits shall clearly specify the date of the outward and the date of the return journey. In case a certain party engaging a contract carriage on a temporary permit wishes to change the date of the return journey subsequent to the grant of the permit, it shall obtain permission in writing to that effect from the Transport Authority within whose jurisdiction the contract carriage happens to be at that time.

(2) Special Permit under Section 88(8) of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.

There shall be no restriction on the number of special permits to be issued under section 88(8) of the Act by the Transport Authorities of either State. Such permits shall be valid for a period not exceeding thirty days in the reciprocating State.

So far as Uttar Pradesh is concerned, tax payable to Government of Uttar Pradesh in respect of temporary permits shall be made through e-payment or Bank Drafts drawn on any Nationalized Bank of India. In case payment has been made through bank draft the temporary permits number shall be mentioned on the back of Bank Draft to avoid the possibility of its being misused or utilized against any other permit. Details of e-payment or the number, date and amount of the Bank Draft, as the case may be, shall be entered on the temporary permits. The bank draft shall be drawn in the name of the Transport Commissioner, Uttar Pradesh payable only at Head quarter or the Regional Transport Offices in whose area the vehicle enters in Uttar Pradesh. So far as Punjab State is concerned, the bank draft shall be drawn in the name of the State Transport Commissioner, Punjab, Chandigarh payable only at the Headquarter of the Regional Transport Office in whose area the vehicle enters in Punjab. The bank drafts shall be handed over by the driver or the person incharge of the vehicle on the tax collection center or border touching office of RTO/ARTO or mobile enforcement squad of the Transport Department which is nearest from the border before commencing the further journey. In case there is any deficiency in the amount of tax so remitted, it will be assessed and realized in cash at there for which necessary receipt in the pressribed

7. Taxation

- (i) The taxes of the reciprocating State in respect of different types of vehicle operating on various class of permits will be payable as per provisions of Taxation Act and Rules of the respective State.
- (ii) However, all types of motor vehicles other than those used for commercial purpose exclusively owned by and used for the purposes of Government of one State shall be exempted from payment of all the taxes leviable in the reciprocating State, except private vehicles having capacity of more than nine persons excluding the driver.

8. Mode of payment of Taxes

The permit issuing authority shall ensure that all taxes of the reciprocating States are paid in advance either by e-payment or Demand Draft drawn on any Nationalized Bank of India. Reciprocating State shall require recovery of its taxes at Tax collection centers or border touching office of RTO/ARTO or mobile enforcement squad of the Transport Department which is nearest from the border before commencing the further journey.

In case advance payment of taxes either by e-payment or Demand Draft the details of e-payment of the number, date and amount of each demand draft through which taxes of the other State has been remitted shall be clearly endorsed on the face of the permits and same be sent to the Secretary, State Transport Authority, Punjab and in case of Uttar Pradesh, shall be sent to the Transport Commissioner (Central pool), Uttar Pradesh, Lucknow.

In case, where advance payment has not been made through e-payment, the Transport Authority of each State granting such permit shall direct the owner/driver to pay the taxes at the Tax Collection Centers or border touching office of RTO/ARTO or mobile enforcement squad of the Transport Department which is nearest from the border before commencing the further journey.

Copies of all temporary permits and special permits together with details of e-payment or Demand Drafts drawn on any Nationalised Bank of India and other relevant information shall immediately be sent to the Secretary, State Transport Authority, Punjab and in the cases of Uttar Pradesh, copies of such temporary permits/special permits shall be sent to the Transport Commissioner (Central Pool) Uttar Pradesh, Lucknow along with details of e-payment or Demand Draft at monthly intervals.

9. Stage Carriage

The operation of stage carriages shall be governed in the following manner:-

(i) Reciprocal agreement with regard to the operation of stage carriages (buses) on interstate routes between State of Uttar Pradesh and Punjab shall be according to the details contained in Appendix AI, Appendix A-II and Appendix B. The number of trips allocated for each State on each interstate route shall be fixed, as far as possible according to the length of route falling in each State. The operation on inter-state routes can also be undertaken as specified under sub-section (1-A) of section 103 of the Act.

> Provided that where a part of the route mentioned in either of appendices lies in States other than Uttar Pradesh and Punjab, the operation on the part of the route lying in that other state will commence only after the reciprocal agreement signed under Section 88 (6) of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 with that other State.

(ii) If for any reasons, it has not been possible to decide an application for a permit on any of the routes mentioned in the appendices lies in States other than Uttar Pradesh and Punjab, the operation on the part of the route lying in that other State will commence only after the reciprocal agreement signed under Section 88(6) of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 with that other State.

Provided that the application for renewal of permits has been submitted to the concerned authority within the time allowed for submission of renewal applications under section 81(2) of the Act.

(iii) Within 15 days from the date of issuance of regular/temporary permit, the permit holder will have to submit application for countersignature to concerned State, otherwise granted permit may be revoked.

(iv) The stage carriages of reciprocating State will have to display logo or legend as prescribed by the State Transport Authorities of the concerned States.

(v) A trip for the purpose of this Agreement will mean one single trip. The route mentioned in appendix always mean the shortest direct route connecting the two terminals lying in the two States through via mentioned and any discrepancy discovered, altering in the kilometerage shown in the said Appendix shall promptly be corrected through correspondence between Transport Authorities of the two States and shall not be treated as modification of the Agreement.

- (vi) The initial time table shall be fixed by the permit granting authority on purely provisional basis, which shall be valid for a maximum period of four months, and shall be countersigned as such, the enable immediate operation of the service. During this period, the countersigning authority shall in consultation with the permit granting authority finalize the time table.
- (vii) Fares, freights, tax and bus stops/stations shall be in accordance with the prevalent provisions/arrangement in respect of States from time to time. The form of tickets issued in one State shall be deemed to be valid in the other State.
- (viii) No restriction shall be imposed by Countersigning Authority to pickup or setting down passengers on the portion of such route lying in concerned States.
- (ix) The Secretary/Principal Secretary of the reciprocating States may, after completing necessary legal requirement, provide for operation on new routes and increase the trips on existing routes by mutual agreement in writing and such action taken by them shall be deemed to be part of this Agreement.
- (x) The State Transport Undertakings of both the States can operate any interstate route by any vehicle out of their fleet, owned or hired by concerned State Transport Undertaking.

10. Countersignature.

Permits issued within the terms of this Agreement by the State should normally be disposed of/countersigned immediately on presentation before the Regional/State Transport Authority on the recommendations of the Secretary, Regional/State Transport Authority of the concerned States subject to payment of countersignature fee and other taxes due to the respective State.

11. General

(i) The respective reciprocating State shall accord recognition to the tax token, driver's and conductor's license, transport vehicle

authorization badge, certificate of fitness etc. issued under the relevant rules of each of two States in respect of their vehicles plying in accordance with this Agreement.

- (ii) If the permit holder of a vehicle operating under permit issued by one State and countersigned by the other State fails to pay the taxes of the other State and after coming into arrears stop the operation, both the States shall assist each other in recovery of the tax from such defaulter.
- (iii) This reciprocal agreement shall come into force from the date of publication of this Agreement in the Official Gazette and shall be valid up to such time as a new agreement between the parties hereto is arrived at or reviewed or rescinded for reasons to be given in writing by either party on six months prior notice.
